



City Street Tree Program

Small Trees

(Heights of 30 feet and less when mature)

Planting area of not less than 4 feet. Low overhead wires.

Service Berry

Grows to 30 feet in height with dark green foliage in the spring and summer, red in the fall.

Forest Pansy Red Bud

Grows to 25 feet in height with a rose pink flower. Foliage is purple to dark green in the spring and summer, reddish purple to orange in the fall.

Winter King Hawthorne

White flower with bright red fruit. Tree grows to a height of 30 feet. Foliage is dark green in the spring and summer, yellow to orange foliage in the fall.

Pacific Sunset Maple

Grows to 30 feet in height. Foliage is bright green during the spring and summer; yellow, orange, and red foliage in the fall.

Japanese Tree Lilac

Grows to a height of 25 feet with creamy white flower clusters in the spring. Tree has a dark green foliage in the spring, summer, and fall.

Medium Trees

(Heights of 30 to 50 feet when mature)

Planting area of not less than 6 feet. Overhead wires not less than 35 feet from ground.

American Elm Hybrid

Tree grows to a height of 55 feet with glossy, dark green foliage during spring and summer, foliage turns yellow in the fall.

Legacy Sugar Maple

Rapid growing tree that grows to 60 feet in height. Dark green foliage during spring and summer, bright red, reddish-orange foliage during the fall.

Hackberry

Pale green leaves in spring and soft yellow leaves in the fall. Grows to a height of 50 feet.

Chinkapin Oak

Grows to a height of 45 feet with dark green foliage in the spring and summer, yellow foliage in the fall.

Crimson King Norway Maple

Tree grows to a height of 45 feet. Deep purple foliage during the spring and summer which turns darker purple and brown in the fall.

Shingle Oak

Grows to a height of 55 feet. Glossy dark green foliage in the spring and summer, brownish yellow and red foliage in the fall.

Red Sunset Red Maple

Grows to a height of 50 feet tall with glossy dark green in the spring and summer with bright red foliage in the fall.

Large Trees

(Heights of greater than 50 feet when mature)

Planting area 8 feet or more. No Overhead wires.

Swamp White Oak

Grows to 65 feet in height. Dark green upper leaf with light green bottom leaf foliage during the spring and summer, foliage turns yellow in the fall.

Northern Red Oak

Grows to 70 feet in height. Dark green foliage with turning red in the fall.

Bald Cypress

Grows to 80 feet in height and has light green foliage turning yellowish red in the fall.

Freemania Maple

Grows to 70 feet in height with rich green foliage in the spring and summer, foliage turns red or yellow in the fall.

Burr Oak

Grows up to 90 feet in height with glossy green with pale underside foliage in spring and summer. Foliage turns yellowish brown in the fall.

Care Instructions

Watering

Newly planted trees should be watered slowly with ten gallons of water once a week during dry periods. Avoid over watering.

Fertilizing

Please contact the Public Works Department before applying fertilizer.

Trimming

During the first year of two, remove small growth on the bark face with your hand; this will not damage the tree. Light trimming may be needed in the future with pruners. Contact the Public Works Department after the tree reaches three (3) years in age for trimming.

Mulching

Prepare the area for mulching by lightly loosening the soil and removing weeds. Apply a good grade, medium course mulch three inches (3") in depth. Keep mulch six inches (6") from the trunk. Placing mulch directly against the bark could cause the tree to develop crown rot.

Damage

Avoid running into the tree with a lawnmower or weedeater. This can severely damage the tree. Also avoid blowing lawnmower clippings over mulch area around the tree.
