Before discussion of any old business, Pastor Tim Kufeldt of Dayspring Church spoke with the members of S.O.S. about an opportunity to assist families in the Springdale community. Dayspring is hosting an event sponsored by STAR Touring & Riding Association. They are looking to sponsor 800 needy and at-risk families with food supplies, hygiene products and other various personal items on July 20, 2016 from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

Discussion commenced regarding how many vouchers we would have, and if Willows Work Group could be added to help S.O.S. on this opportunity. Chief Mathis stated that he will give Marsha and Joe Ture's information to work with them. He would also have Marsha Hctor talk with the school nurses.

Greg Karle asked if it was only for families with children or if elderly could be helped as well. It was mentioned that perhaps Jean Hicks could be asked for names of shut-ins that could use this type of help. Chief Mathis stated that he would get Matt Clayton up to date on this. Any extra volunteers would also be appreciated.

Mr. Poindexter

Mr. Poindexter is a WWII Veteran. Mr. Poindexter's daughter lives with her father but suffered a massive stroke approximately a month ago and is currently at Drake Hospital. Chief Mathis proceeded to give a brief summary of the current situation with Mr. Poindexter. The Disabled American Veterans (D.A.V.) went with Matt Clayton and Joe Ture to visit with Mr. Poindexter and help assess the situation. There was talk of perhaps getting a Public Works truck and D.A.V. could help with clean up. A new refrigerator is needed because his refrigerator currently in his house is inoperable. There is concern as to how long he will be able to be on his own without daughter present. D.A.V. is more than willing to provide support and neighbors have been there to help with meals. The possibility of purchasing a very low end refrigerator was brought up in discussion. Joe mentioned Matt's concern for Mr. Poindexter's health that if Mr. Poindexter was placed in an assisted living home that Mr. Poindexter would decline.

Julie Matheny motioned for helping Mr. Poindexter with a low-end refrigerator. All members were in favor of helping. Next question brought up was about logistics in getting the refrigerator to Mr. Poindexter's house. Chief Mathis asked if S.O.S. could authorize a certain amount of money for a refrigerator and have D.A.V. work with Matt on delivery? It was agreed to authorize a maximum of \$400. Mayor Webster will talk with the manager at Lowe's.
