Re: Report on Pending and Future Legislation

Item I

A Resolution Approving the Update of the Hamilton County Solid Waste District's Management Plan

The Hamilton County Solid Waste District has made a request that the City of Springdale ratify the proposed updates to the District's Management Plan as adopted by the District's Policy Committee. In order for the Plan's proposed updates to be approved and thus become effective, the County Commissioners, the City of Cincinnati and sixty percent of the townships and municipalities must ratify the Plan.

Each year, the City of Springdale has received funding from the program in support of the community's recycling efforts. The District is also researching other ways of assisting communities that attempt to preserve our environment through various recycling efforts.

The Plan document is in a large binder and a copy of it can be found in the Clerk of Council/Finance Director's Office. Item II

A Resolution Authorizing the Adoption of An Alternative Formula for Apportioning the Local Government Fund (County Level)

The Hamilton County Auditor has requested that City of Springdale take action to renew the alternative formula for allocating the Local Government Fund at the County level.

In 1988, the distribution process was based simply on the tax budget. In 1989, an alternative formula was approved providing that the Hamilton County Park District receives the first \$300,000 or 1% of the Local Government Fund. Following the initial allocation to the Park District, Hamilton County would receive 40.75% of the Fund and the City of Cincinnati would also receive 40.75%. Another \$100,000 of the remaining funds will be set aside for an emergency fund at the discretion of the Budget Commission for any fiscal emergencies. Further breakdowns of the remaining funds will go toward the smaller jurisdictions and townships.

The formula has been renewed twice (in 1995 and 2004). This renewal will cover the next eight years (2012 – 2020).

A resolution adopting the alternative formula for the allocation of the Local Government Funds (county level), will be before City Council at the **5/2/2012** meeting.
